1.0 Executive Summary

The Kensley Grace Aquatic Center (KGAC) — a proposed 70,000 square foot indoor aquatic facility with over 16,000 square feet of pool deck space and an additional outdoor family pool, waterpark, and surrounding deck area — will serve Henry County families and provide an asset to the immediate surrounding community and Henry County as a whole. The center will add a new dimension of recreation opportunities; providing a full range of aquatic programming including competitive and recreational swimming opportunities, learn-to-swim programs, aqua therapy, an outdoor water park, aquatic exercise classes, and more.

The KGAC will include the following amenities:

- Indoor 50-meter competition pool with spectator seating for more than 1,800
- Indoor 25-yard recreational pool (therapy, exercise & instruction with warmer water)
- Indoor poolside classrooms / party rooms / therapy rooms / fitness rooms
- Spacious lobby and seating areas with pool overlook
- Outdoor family pool with multiple features, a large deck, and pavilions
- Concession stands serving both indoor and outdoor pools
- Generous locker rooms and family restrooms

This plan establishes a fee schedule, a marketing plan, the organizational structure and staffing plan for the center, as well as a financial plan. This plan is based on conservative estimates using comparisons from historical data received from similar public and private facilities in the surrounding metropolitan Atlanta area.

1.1 Mission Statement

The Kensley Grace Aquatic Center will provide Henry County citizens with quality indoor and outdoor aquatic and leisure opportunities in a safe and well-maintained facility that will enable the patrons to enhance their quality of life year-round.

1.2 Objectives

- Provide aquatic recreation and leisure opportunities through a variety of instructional programs, open swim opportunities, an outdoor family pool, therapeutic programs, facility rentals, water safety education, and services designed to meet the citizens' desires and needs.
- Provide a safe and well-maintained facility with a variety of state of the art aquatic structures and amenities to meet the citizens' desires and needs.
- Provide a competitive facility for the youth of Henry County to grow and excel as swimmers.
- Provide a conveniently located facility to host Division 1 and Division 2 conference championships.

1.3 Keys to Success

 A variety of leisure opportunities are offered and expected service delivery is met.

- Reasonable facility hours and fees.
- A clean and well maintained facility that is user friendly and aesthetically pleasing.
- An experienced staff who is well-trained and courteous.
- Building and construction costs that remain within budget.
- Henry County residents enjoying their time at the KGAC, thereby returning as regular patrons while telling others about the quality of the center.
- Promoting the facility as a destination for collegiate and state level swim competitions able to accommodate three to five day swim tournament.

2.0 Kensley Grace Aquatic Center Summary

2.1 Project Introduction

The KGAC will provide aquatic programs for citizens throughout Henry County and its surrounding communities year-round including aqua therapy programs, aquatic exercise classes, learn-to-swim classes as well as competitive swimming and recreational swimming opportunities. The Outdoor Waterpark will provide a fun, cost-effective alternative to other Atlanta area water parks. Local residents will not have to travel outside of Henry County to enjoy similar facilities. An aquatic center of the caliber of the Kensley Grace Aquatic Center will draw visitors from surrounding counties, swim tournaments from around the state and county, and attract new residents and businesses to Henry County.

2.2 Facility Location

The Kensley Grace Aquatic Center will be located at 2020 Henry Parkway Connector McDonough, GA 30253 in the heart of Henry County, situated only 30 minutes from Atlanta. Henry County is "Comfortably South of Atlanta" at the gateway to Middle and South Georgia. Henry County encompasses more than 300 square miles and includes the cities of McDonough, Stockbridge, Locust Grove, and Hampton. According to the 2014 U.S. Census it is home to more than 213,000 residents. The population has nearly doubled since the 2000 U.S. Census and the Atlanta Regional Commission projects Henry County will grow to over 430,000 residents by 2040.

The first of its kind in the county, the KGAC is centrally located within Henry County on a twenty-two acre tract of land at the eastern end of Henry Parkway. The Aquatic Center is conveniently located near the Red Hawk baseball complex and Mercer University's Henry County campus. The Aquatic Center is easily accessed from either Hampton Road/Highway 81 (Exit 218) or McDonough Road/Highway 155 (Exit 216) off of Interstate 75.

2.3 Program Summary

The KGAC will consist of indoor and outdoor components. Both areas are supported by generous locker rooms, family restrooms and concession and vending areas.

Entrance to the indoor components of the facility is through the main lobby which will include the front desk area, concessions, and vending areas, as well as access to the spectator viewing area and stairs and an elevator down to the indoor pools and locker rooms. It will also lead to a unique aspect of this facility, the pool overlook. Accessed from the main lobby, this area will overlook the competition pool and provide a *skybox-like* feel to viewing swim events in the KGAC.

The facility will also include offices for full time staff, a life-guard locker room/office and therapy/treatment room, a mechanical room for the pools, and ample storage. The facility is served by a parking lot with space for more than 300 cars.

Indoor Aquatics

Competition Pool 10,240 square feet) —The main pool will be a 10 lane 50 meter long by 25 yards wide pool with two moveable bulkheads allowing the pool to be divided in two 25 yards pools, or as a single 50 meter pool. The building will feature stadium seating, accommodating more than 1,800 spectators, state of the art scoreboards, more than 16,000 square feet of deck space, and spacious locker rooms. The competition pool will be open year round. This versatility will allow The Kensley Grace Aquatic Center to host a wide array of swim meets including recreational leagues, middle and high school competitions, collegiate, national and Olympic caliber meets. In addition, the pool will be used for swim team practices, lap swimming by the general public, instructional classes, and recreational swimming. It is supported by an electronic timing room, life guard room, two wet classrooms/party rooms (available for rent), men's and women's locker rooms, and a hospitality room accessible to coaches and officials during meets. Directly

accessible from the main lobby there is seating for more than 1,800 spectators on the upper level overlooking the competition pool.

Recreational Pool (2,583 sq. ft.) — Separated from the competition pool by concrete columns and more than 25 feet of deck space, this 8 lane by 25 yard pool ranges in depth from 4 to 5 feet with a zero entry lane ramp for a teaching area. The ramp is ADA compliant in addition to stairs and pool ladders. This pool will be maintained at a slightly warmer temperature than the competition pool and used for aqua therapy, aquatic exercise, instructional programs, and recreational swimming. It is served by 2,400 square feet of deck space. It shares the life guard room, wet classrooms/party rooms, and locker rooms with the competition pool. It has two additional family restrooms in the immediate proximity. The room used for hospitality during meets will double as a family seating area during instructional classes.

Outdoor Aquatics

Outdoor Waterpark (*Name to be Determined) — The nearly 100,000 square foot outdoor family pool is accessible through a separate outdoor gated entrance. This free-formed pool with multiple features is designed for the enjoyment of guests of all ages. Surrounded by over 10,000 square feet of deck space with chaise lounges, dining tables, chairs and umbrellas, the family pool includes many fun features for the enjoyment of our patrons such as a zero entry splash pool that connects to a play pool and a 25 yard lap pool. In addition, the play area will have geysers and deck sprays, an aquatic play structure, water cannons, a current channel/lazy river, and water slides. The outdoor pool is supported by an outdoor pavilion (available for rent), ten cabanas (available for rent), men's and women's locker rooms, two family restrooms, and a concession stand that will also serves the indoor spectator area for the competition pool. The outdoor pool will be open from May to September. This pool will be surrounded by ample seating and family pavilions. The family pavilions will be an ideal location for group swim events and birthday parties. The family pool reinforces the Aquatic Center's goal of being family-focused.

3.0 Market Analysis

The main customer base will be the citizens of Henry County and the surrounding counties who will benefit from the center's location, quality and amenities. These customers will be looking for a safe, easily accessible, high quality facility and programs that can foster an environment of fun, learning, development and improvement. The center will meet the needs of the customer through the various pool components, hours of operation, reasonable prices, proposed staff and programs.

3.1 Market Study

4.2 Fee Schedule

Based on market research and the projected attendance figures the following fee schedule is necessary to recover the expected operational costs of the Kensley Grace Aquatic Center. Initial fee schedules and attendance projections, while more conservative, showed cost recovery between 77% and 89%. In order to increase cost recovery and shift the expense to the end user, admission fees were increased approximately 22%. Other fees for lane rentals, pool rentals and instructional classes were not raised because we believe they are currently at the level that the market will bear.

5.0 Management Summary

The following information provides a recommended hiring plan, job synopses and organizational chart for the Kensley Grace Aquatic Center. Position Synopses

Aquatics Manager/Coordinator: Responsible for the daily operations of the center including supervisory duties over staff. Plan and implement goals, objectives and strategies for the center. Responsible for administrative and budgetary duties such as developing and implementing center budget, training, scheduling, public relations, marketing, customer service and purchasing; prepares reports for financials, registration, and attendance. Accountable for daily monies collected. Maintain communication with user groups, other divisions and the general public to assure effective operations. Receive and deal with requests, complaints and concerns of the public. Must possess and maintain Aquatic Facility Operator and/or Certified Pool Operator and CPR/First Aid certifications. Prefer Lifeguard Instructor and/or Water Safety Instructor.

Pool Mechanic: Responsible for operation of all pools in the aquatic center including maintaining, servicing and cleaning pools; maintaining and servicing all related equipment and machinery. In addition, perform custodial duties as

necessary. Supervise full-time maintenance staff. Must possess and maintain Aquatic Facility Operator and/or Certified Pool Operator certification.

Receptionist/Registrar: Perform responsible and varied secretarial and administrative tasks for the facility; provide support for individuals in managerial positions; perform program registrations and facility reservations; handle routine complaints, inquiries and requests while performing front desk and reception responsibilities for incoming patrons. Supervise part-time front desk staff.

Maintenance Worker: Maintain and clean the aquatic center and all structures for public use by assuring necessary custodial and maintenance tasks are completed on a daily basis and in a timely manner.

Part Time Year-Round & Seasonal Staff: These positions will include the following roles.

Part Time Supervisor: Responsible for the safety and security of all staff, patrons, and aquatic facility functions in the absence of Aquatics Manager or Coordinator. Perform supervisory duties for lifeguards. Must possess and maintain current certification in Lifeguard Training, CPR and First Aid. Prefer Lifeguard Instructor and/or Water Safety Instructor.

Head Lifeguard: Assist in overseeing lifeguard staff, pool operations, safety and facility cleanliness. Ensure that all regulations and policies are enforced. Must possess and maintain current certification in Lifeguard Training, CPR and First Aid.

Lifeguards: Responsible for the safety and health of all patrons and enforcement of all facility and agency regulations and policies. Must possess and maintain current certification in Lifeguard Training, CPR and First Aid.

Water Safety Instructor: Responsible for instruction of learn to swim classes as assigned and in accordance with American Red Cross standards. Must possess and maintain Water Safety Instructor certification.

Front Desk: Responsible for providing a point of contact for walk-in traffic, incoming telephone calls, granting access to the facility, and supporting the highest levels of customer service for participants, staff and visitors. Performs program registrations and facility reservations; handles routine complaints, inquiries and requests while performing front desk, reception responsibilities for incoming patrons.

Part Time Concessionaire: Responsible for all aspects of concession operations to include preparation and sales of concession items to patrons, cleaning and collection of monies. Positive customer and staff relations are essential.

6.0 Financial Plan

KGAC will be self sustained, fully private aquatic center. KGAC has budgeted set-up costs so as to offset three years of operational costs, with the understanding that after the first three years of full-time operations, the aquatic center will support itself financially with surplus to be set aside in a general improvements fund for future use.

6.1 Start-up Facility Budget

The following items represent the initial equipment purchases and expenses needed for the operation of the several pools prior to opening the KGAC. In order to show a true operational cost in the first year of operations, these necessary costs are shown in a separate budget.

6.2 Three Year Revenue & Expenditure Projections

The following is a projection of the first three years of revenues and expenses associated with operating the KGAC. With an anticipated opening date of May 2019, the first budget cycle impacted by the KGAC is FY2019. With some staff hired and expenses incurred prior to opening the facility, we anticipate approximately eleven months of expenses and seven months of revenue in the first fiscal year. We will be open for the entire summer season in FY2019 which will have a positive effect on revenue.

Expenses and revenues increase from the partial year in FY2019 to a full 12 month operation in FY2020. We anticipate growth in revenue during the second year with the facility reaching maturity and its full potential in the third year of operation. To offset

the difference between expenses and revenues, we have worked into our start-up budget approximately two years of operating costs.

6.3 Projected Revenue Breakdowns

By comparing historical data from established programs and facilities similar to the Kensley Grace Aquatic Center and applying the proposed fee schedule we projected revenues in each of the various categories. These figures represent a full year of a mature operation and are reflected in the third year after the opening date (FY2021).

Fees

Admission fees are the combined total of daily, 3-month, and annual passes to both the indoor pools for lap/open swim and the Outdoor Waterpark. Projections were based on conservative assumptions given the number of residents in and around Henry County as well as the number of high school swim teams and other competitive swim teams in the area with need for a more convenient aquatic center.

7.0 Economic Impact

The Kensley Grace Aquatic Center will have a healthy economic impact on Henry County with reasonable expectations totaling a nearly \$3 million annual increase to the businesses surrounding the aquatic center from just Atlanta area swim teams use of the center. Further estimates of the economic impact of the KGAC are set out in tables in the Appendix.

8.0 Conclusion

The Kensley Grace Aquatic Center will be a state of the art facility offering a new facet of recreation opportunities to Henry County citizens. The centralized location, quality program plan, unique features and amenities will meet the needs of our customers including families, competitive swimmers, recreational swimmers, learn-to-swim students, therapeutic patients, aqua exercisers and more.

In planning for the operation of this facility, our staff engaged an aquatics consultant with more than 30 years of experience in operating public pools. Working together, we studied the operations of similar public facilities in the metro area including their programs, fee schedules, revenues and expenses. We evaluated the many options with the intent to find a balance between cost recovery and service delivery. Based on these findings, the experience of our consultant and the proposed program for the KGAC we have recommended this plan because we feel it has the greatest potential to recover operational costs while providing competitive prices and quality services for our customers.

The Kensley Grace Aquatic Center will be a community asset and unique selling point that may attract potential residents and businesses to the county. Similar facilities have made significant economic impacts in other communities. The KGAC will become a crown jewel for our community and help Henry County continue to reach our goal of preserving the Beauty, Unique Character, and Desirability of the Community where we live, work and play, Comfortably South of Atlanta.
